



## **2021 COVID-19 Protection Plan**

The goal of this plan is to keep clients, employees, contractors, and the communities that support Kulik Lodge safe and healthy by minimizing the risk of exposure to COVID-19 during the course of normal business operations. Kulik Lodge relies on the guidance of the State of Alaska and the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC) to establish procedures intended to keep you safe during your stay with us.

To the best of our ability, Kulik Lodge plans to follow the latest CDC recommendations to protect against potential COVID-19 exposure. The latest CDC recommendations can be viewed at the link below:

While safety is our top priority at Kulik Lodge, ensuring all of our guests are comfortable during their stay is also extremely important to us. Recent CDC guidelines has suggested that fully vaccinated individuals no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance while socializing. Thus, masks and social distancing is optional for fully vaccinated guests at the lodge or while fishing. However, we recognize that not everyone may be vaccinated, and respect that not everyone may be comfortable socializing in congregate settings without wearing a mask and/or social distancing at this time. If this is the case, we are happy to provide special accommodations to maintain social distance from staff and guests to the best of our ability.

### **Traveling to Alaska**

The state of Alaska does not have any special entry or travel testing requirements to enter the state. It is recommended that non-vaccinated individuals get tested prior to travel in hopes to limit the spread of COVID-19, however this is not required. Travelers may also test for free upon arrival. The state does NOT recommend fully vaccinated travelers get tested unless experiencing symptoms of COVID-19.

### **Traveling to Kulik Lodge with Katmai Air**

You will be traveling to Kulik Lodge on a private aircraft via Katmai Air. Katmai Air is committed to following CDC guidelines to minimize the spread of COVID-19. Federal law requires passengers to wear a mask while on the aircraft and while in a transportation hub. As such, masks are required to be worn by all passengers while on the aircraft and in the Katmai Air terminal.

### **While at the Lodge**

- As recommended by the CDC, all guests will still be required to wear a face covering when traveling in lodge vans and planes.
- As recommended by the CDC, those that are vaccinated will not be required to wear masks or social distance while at the lodge or while fishing.
- As recommended by the CDC, those that are not vaccinated are expected to wear a mask when social distance is not possible.
- Commonly used surfaces and loaner gear will be disinfected regularly by lodge staff.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be conveniently located around the lodge.



### **In the Event of an Infection**

Kulik Lodge and nearby communities are not equipped to respond to COVID-19 cases. If you develop a fever or other COVID-19 related symptoms during your stay at Kulik Lodge, you will be required to isolate yourself from others. You will then be transported to Anchorage as soon as possible via appropriate medical transportation. It is your financial responsibility to cover the cost of such transportation regardless of the medical condition. Kulik Lodge can assist with arrangements but will have no financial obligation for the evacuation.

### **After Your Trip**

If you or anyone in your party becomes ill within 48 hours of your trip completion, please let us know. This helps keep our staff and guests safe by allowing us to determine who else may have been exposed.
